FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Jesus Became Sin

Why was Jesus in such deep agony the night of His betrayal? Luke 22:44 says "And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground." Greek for agony is Agonia, which means a conflict. Jesus was having a conflict not with Himself but with an enemy. He was struggling with sin and presumably with Satan.

Think about these two facts: 1) Holiness is totally repulsed by sin. 2) Jesus became sin. 2 Cor. 5:21 "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." Jesus was totally, irrevocably, immutably holy. And yet Christ became "a curse for us" as Galatians 3:13 says. We know to a small degree what it is like to bear the guilt of sin. We sin and we feel a heavy weight on our hearts and consciences. The closer we grow to Christ, that revulsion for sin grows to the point where we want to expel it from our lives. For Jesus, sin contradicts everything in His character. And yet Jesus obediently took on the weight of all the sins of all the people for all time that was to be paid for. Is it any wonder, considering the full weight of the wrath of God about to be poured out on Him and becoming the sin that He despised, that His sweat would be as blood? The payment for sin was the single most agonizing act ever performed by a person.

Jesus was not just agonizing over the beatings He would endure. He was not just agonizing over having the nails driven into His hands; he was agonizing about bearing the weight of all the sin that would be paid for once and for all by His one act of obedience. John Macarthur says aptly, "His very soul was repulsed by the encroachment of His sin bearing, not because of the physical pain He would endure but because of his taking upon himself there the full magnitude and defilement of all man's iniquity." We can only stand in awe as we contemplate the horrors Jesus experienced as He faced sin. And we should utter a "Thank you," because it was our sin He paid for.




